WHY PARTICIPATE?

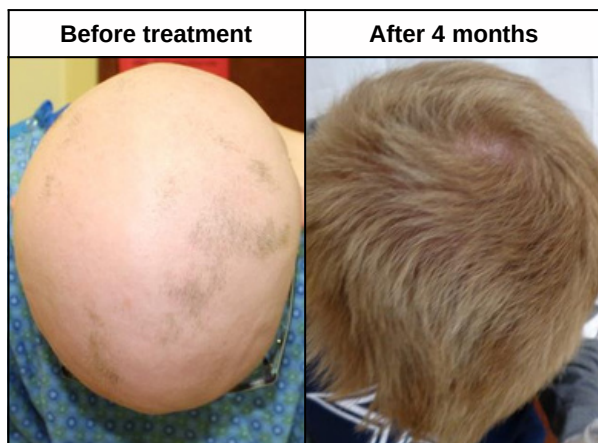
1. Help scientists better understand immune system dysregulation in people with Down syndrome.
2. See if the drug Tofacitinib is a safe and effective treatment for immune skin conditions.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

People with Down syndrome between 12-50 years old who have one of the following moderate to severe skin conditions:

- alopecia areata (hair loss)
- hidradenitis suppurativa (boils)
- psoriasis (scaly, itchy skin)
- atopic dermatitis (eczema)
- vitiligo (pigmentation loss)

Participants must be accompanied by a study partner.



WHAT IS INVOLVED?

1. Attend 8 visits over ~5 months in Denver, CO, for blood draws and physical exams.
 2. Take oral medication twice per day.
 3. Play thinking and memory games with study staff.
- Compensation provided. Travel assistance available.*
